Nominations

"Additional nominations may be made by petition if each petition is signed by five (5) members of the Chapter in good standing and submitted to the Chapter Secretary within thirty (30) days of the announcement of the slate to the Chapter membership."

The election itself will take place by mail. After the 30 day period for additional nominations has passed, our Secretary Bob Ebert will mail ballots to all members, along with a self-addressed, stamped envelope. The election needs to happen by May 31, but we hope to have it completed by our annual meeting on May 15.

Noel Ilg, 1926-2015

Noel Ilg, an honorary life member of our chapter, died on December 15, 2015, surrounded by family.

He was born on December 18, 1926 in Cleveland to musical parents. He graduated from Avon Lake High School as president of the class and student council in 1944. He met Frances, his wife-to-be, in the choir loft at St. Joseph Church, Avon Lake. They were married in 1952 and parented seven children followed by 23 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren.

His choral musical background is extensive, having sung in many choirs throughout high school and under many directors such as Henri Zabawski, Daniel Moe, Robert Page, Ernie Hisey, Nelson Harper, George Szell, and the Cleveland Orchestra Chorus when Robert Shaw was directing. Vocally he studied with Angelo Domalos and John Howard Tucker. Instrumentally, he was taught piano by James Drake in Avon Lake, Howard Wells in Chicago, and Leon Machin in Cleveland. He also played piccolo and flute. He founded and directed the Avon Lake Oratorio & Orchestra consisting of 95 voices and 42 instrumentalists. The formation and direction of



brass and string ensembles, adult and children handbell choirs, adult and children choirs, adult and children cantors took place when, for fifty-two years, he was the Director of Music in churches in Avon Lake, Cleveland, Lorain, and Westlake. He was president of the Diocesan Music and Liturgy Commission and auditioned and directed a Diocesan choir at St. John Cathedral in Cleveland. He has been the recipient of the Outstanding Man of the Year award in Avon Lake and a five-state first place award for outstanding music and liturgy by the National Association of Pastoral Musicians.

Civically, he served as councilman-at-large, chair for many committees and was president of the Avon Lake Business Association. He was Chair or Co-Chairman for seven 4th of July Fireworks Celebrations. He was a charter member of the Fr. Ragan Council of the Knights of Columbus and was their "Catholic Man of the Year" in 1967. He was responsible for "Operation CTS" (bringing buses from Cleveland to Avon Lake), "Operation Industrial Appreciation" for Avon Lake, and "Operation Communication" which resulted in Community Calling (reduced rate for the first 120 minutes of long distance telephone calls). Received Avon Lake Junior Chamber of Commerce Distinguished Service Award.

After his discharge from the Navy, where he was a technical instructor, he founded Ilg Radio Service, which later became Ilg TV & Appliance and remained in business for 33 years. After, he continued to repair antique radios, car radios and record changers, and was known as Ye Olde Radio Shoppe. He also taught private piano lessons in his home.

He is survived by children Cecilia M. McKay (Terrence) of Avon Lake, Stephen J. (Anna) of Avon Lake, Kenneth R. (Teresa) of Somers Point, NJ, Bernadette A. Hisey (Ernest) of Westlake, Gregory R. of Raleigh, North Carolina, Theresa M. Martin (Thomas) of Avon Lake, and Christopher P. (Kate) of Medina; 23 grandchildren; and 13 great grandchildren. He is preceded in death by his wife Frances (nee Dister); infant son, Noel Jr.; and brothers Albert L. and Joseph M.
