## **January Jubilee**

We are all invited to attend a January Jubilee on Saturday, January 28, at Emmanuel Episcopal Church in La Grange, IL. This event, sponsored by the Fox Valley and Southwest Suburban Chapters of the American Guild of Organists, will be a day of inspiration for the part-time church musician, including 10 skill-enhancing workshops, a catered lunch, music displays (with music for sale), music reading sessions, a keynote message, networking, and two short recitals. Sessions will utilize both a Casavant pipe organ and a Rodgers digital organ.

## **FCT Settlement**

As you may know, the AGO has been negotiating for many months with the Federal Trade Commission to settle a complaint that the FTC initiated in 2015 alleging that the Guild may be violating Federal antitrust laws. As the result of a Settlement Agreement that the AGO is entering into with the Federal Trade Commission, the AGO is no longer permitted to publish Salary Guidelines, Model Contracts, or Model Contract Provisions. Accordingly, these documents and guidelines have been removed from the AGO's website.

Our chapter is also prohibited from publishing these items, which we did not generally do in any case.
